Revival in the Body of Christ

So the Lord spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend. And he would return to the camp, but his servant Joshua the son of Nun, a young man, did not depart from the tabernacle. (Ex.33:11). God spoke to Moses in person; He did not use ways of communication e.g. an angel, or dreams, etc. They also had conversations like friends – freely, familiarly, plainly, cordially, openly, without any reserve or show of authority, or causing dread and fear. Moses returned to share His encounters with God with the people. Moses' servant, Joshua, however remained in the tabernacle. How often do we admire our leaders and the wisdom they portray? Joshua followed in the footsteps of the one he served by remaining in the presence of the Lord. **Heavenly Father we desire a face-to-face relationship with You, dwelling in Your courts forever. Testimony: God multiplies food

A feeding for 50 orphaned and desperately poor children in Kaliti Village, Uganda where the *Field of Dreams* project is located was organized. Over 200 children showed up hungry! Several of the team members were crying because they knew there was not enough food for all of the kids and some would have to be sent away hungry. They began to pray that God would multiply the food. EVERY child ate and was full...over 200 were fed an abundant feast! Not only that, but every adult ate as well. Pray for your community: Sex offences against children

The NSPCC (National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children) has released a new report suggesting that more than 21,000 sex offences against children were reported in England and Wales last year – that is around 60 every day. The charity says that, however shocking this figure is, it still does not come close to revealing the true extent of child sexual abuse, failing to take into account those incidents that go unreported, and may be repeated on a frequent basis. Pray that these children would be protected and that they would be able to feel safe and secure in their own home and neighbourhood. Pray for Christian ministries working to protect children at risk. Praise God for these ministries, and pray that they would bear much fruit.**

South Africa: Job crisis

A recent report by the research arm of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) warns that the job crisis in South Africa is far from over and could even worsen unless adequate action is taken and support measures remain in place. Jobs data due out next month are expected to show that about 1 million jobs were lost last year in South Africa. In the first nine months of the year 959 000 jobs were shed. Pray that God will provide jobs for those who have lost their jobs over the last year. Pray that God will restore the hope in the lives of those who have become hopeless and are considering becoming involved in illegal activities to have money to put bread on the table.**

International: Haiti

As you are certainly aware, Haiti was struck by a devastating 7.1 earthquake. Yet the aftermath of the earthquake may actually prove more catastrophic than the earthquake itself. Consider: in the capital city, Port-au-Prince, there are only a few structurally sound buildings remaining. Food supplies are rapidly diminishing, as are medical supplies. There is no electricity and no water to help this city of over two million people who are now homeless. Hospitals are unable to absorb and care for the many injured, and skilled medical personnel, though arriving daily, are still in short supply. Remember also, there is no functioning government right now in Haiti. In Port-au-Prince there is little heavy equipment to help clear the roads or assist in rescue. Pray that the Holy Spirit will comfort and counsel them because of the traumatic effect the work has on them. Pray that the powers of witchcraft and voodoo will be broken over that nation and that many will come to the knowledge of God the Father and Jesus Christ whom He has sent.**
